What is an idiom?

An idiom is a phrase where the meaning is not literal – the phrase is not describing something true that is happening, but refers to a hidden meaning. For example, the idiom *'it's raining cats and dogs'* does not mean that cats and dogs are falling from the sky like rain – the meaning is that it is raining a lot. Idioms are used frequently by native speakers of English and, when used correctly, can make your English sound more natural.

Look at these ten common idioms. Read the idioms (on the left) and match to the meanings (on the right.)
