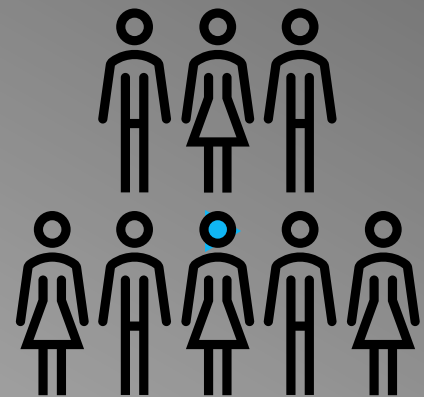

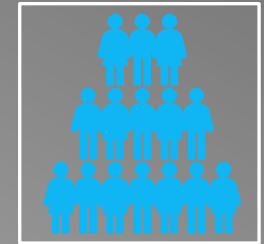

The why

From the social-educational point of view, the two-week youth culture camp should contribute to...

... getting to know each other and exchange perspectives on concrete topics;

... uncovering and dismantling one-sided and / or stereotypical images of the "others" and their respective countries of origin or develop a constructive way of dealing with them;

... getting to know and developing concrete possibilities to get involved in society and to stand up for their ideas and wishes;

... learn to see themselves as part of the local/German society and develop a feeling of being at home "here".

... offering young people with migration / refugee experience the chance to improve their language skills

The how

From the artistic point of view, the two-week youth culture camp finally contributed to the following:

- *Basic knowledge about the medium of film was taught, and monologues, dialogues and short stories suitable for film were developed.*
- *We were able to borrow material such as iPads, reflex cameras, green screens, lighting and other equipment from the media library in the Diepholz County.*
- *The participants learned how to shoot small films themselves, but also the aesthetic basics of image composition. Furthermore, the young people learned and experienced an introduction to the basics and handling of cameras, sound recording devices, animation techniques and simple editing programmes in workshops.*
- *To find ideas, various impulses were given in small groups and their own stories were developed in moderated group processes. Finally, the focus was on the development, planning, implementation, post-production and presentation of an own exhibit in a small group.*
- *The exhibits and results created in the small groups were presented at the end of the youth culture camp in a publicly advertised “multimedia show”.*

More team time to reflect on the day is very much lacking, as the teamers had to take some of the young people home and there is no time afterwards to reflect on the day.

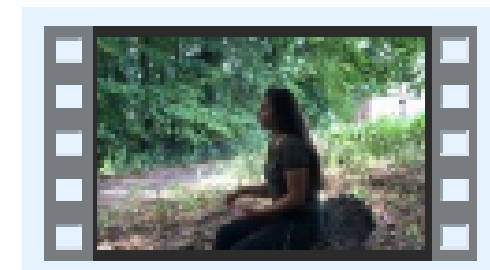
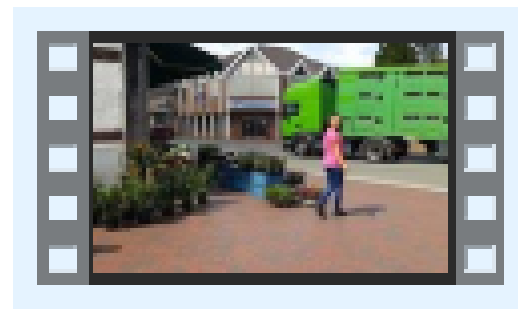
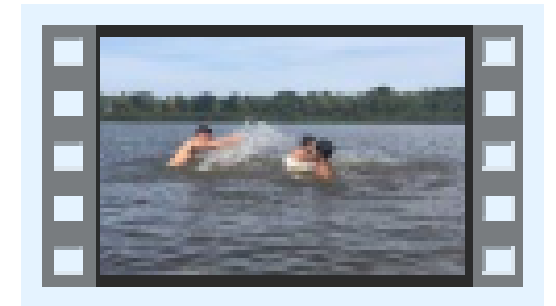
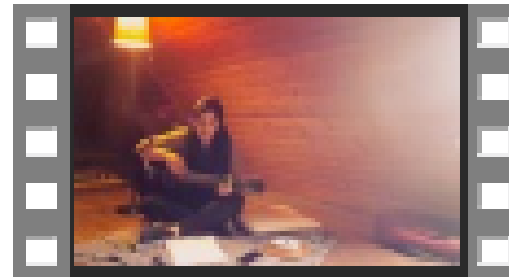
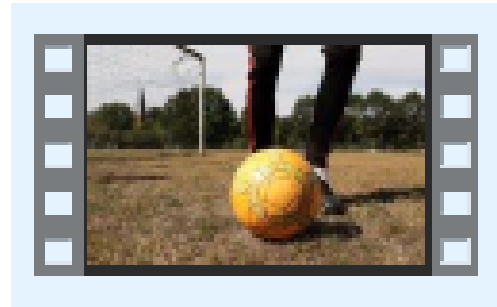
The young people should not be allowed to take the equipment home. Make it clear that the loan of equipment is the responsibility of the VNB team.
